BACKGROUND:

Policy 2: Role of the Board, Section 8.3 requires the Board approve substantive budget adjustments when necessary.

COVID Budget

Administration has re-evaluated the estimated medical illness expense due to COVID for the 2020-21 year with data up to February 17 and is recommending a decrease in this budget of \$850,000.

The original estimate for illness costs was completed in the summer when cases were quite low in Alberta. Estimates of absenteeism of 148% were used as that data was shared from daycares in the United States as this was the only applicable data available at the time. There were many unknowns about the virus – and the impact on staff staying home when not well, including the length of time to get a COVID test and its results. Data was analyzed from the start of the year and at several points from the start of the year until December 4 to review the rates of increase. It was interesting to note that although we saw significantly more cases in November, the



percent change, year over year, in total illness up to December 4 in the last 30 days and in the last 10 days compared to the last 62 days up to December 4 is relatively the same.

We also thought medical/illness family leave would have increased substantially but, we are not seeing that trend. We are seeing a downward trend in medical appointments – likely due to staff deferring visits to the doctor, dentist, etc. Additionally, no substitute teacher is required for teachers quarantined with their class due to a student testing positive when the teacher is not ill, as the teacher can teach from home using Brightspace. This was a savings not considered originally. In January, based on this review, the illness budget was reduced by \$1,000,000.

Illness data to February 17 was reviewed. Likely due to the circuit breaker in December, COVID cases in our schools were low in January and February. We have continued to use the illness rates that were used in December (120% for HR, 82% for schools), however, we have only applied these rates to the remaining four months of the school year (maternity, medical, illness temp contract and illness temp sub were estimated differently based on actual known numbers to date and what we have projected out). The feeling is that the rates for October to December were worst case and represent what could occur from March to June (a gradual increase to something higher).

What cannot be factored in is illness caused by stress. As the year proceeds, there is a high likelihood of this increasing. We are certain, due to the lengthened time between break periods in the second half of the year, that we will see an uptick in staff absenteeism. There will also be increased medical days taken at the schools in the upcoming months to allow for time taken to be vaccinated and potential illness due to the vaccination as well. Our continued conservatism is also based on the unknown. As of April 6, we are in our third wave with new lockdowns due to the easier spread of the variants. There has been a recent increase in cases at our schools.

Based on all the factors detailed above, management is estimating a remaining balance of \$2.046 million will be adequate for the remainder of the school year.

Additionally, at the time of projections, \$243,000 was projected as surplus in the PPE and custodial budget due to savings from donated PPE, better estimates of PPE needs, and custodial savings not anticipated.

To Be Allocated (TBA)

Based on the above changes to estimates, we have also adjusted the amount of dollars available in the TBA budget. Please refer to Attachment 1 for a reconciliation.



In addition to the reduction in illness budget, there are 2020-21 costs totaling \$183,500 requiring approval.

- <u>Election Costs:</u> An additional \$45,000 may be needed for the upcoming election and should be accrued this year as the annual allocation of \$50,000 per year for a balance of \$200,000 in 2021 will not be quite enough.
- <u>Furniture and Equipment</u> to support four modulars for \$50,000 (the items need to be ordered soon for delivery by August 31).
- <u>Curriculum</u> \$50,000 to start work on analyzing new curriculum to prepare our staff for Sept. 1, 2022
- Evergreening (replacing) Student Computers \$30,000 for schools in need
- Occupational Health and Safety \$8,500 for strobe lights (emergency notification system)

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once the Board of Trustees approve the changes to the estimates for COVID and the TBA requests, EIPS will communicate this information to the various stakeholders (senior administration and directors) and make the necessary budget adjustments.

BACKGROUND:

Policy 2: Role of the Board establishes that the Board of Trustees will approve transfer of funds to reserves.

In review of the Division's Aug. 31, 2020 financial position in the fall of 2020, an opportunity was identified to transfer funds from operating reserves to capital reserves. Specifically, transferring \$1,000,000 from Division Unallocated operating reserves to capital reserves would allow the Division to ensure adequate funds have been set aside to keep capital assets in the Division updated and maintained, and guarantee funds would be available should an urgent, unexpected capital need arise.

For the 2020-21 budget year, the province enacted Bill 5, which requires school divisions receive ministerial approval to access and transfer operating reserves. Approval to transfer up to \$1,000,000 from operating reserves to capital reserves was received from the Minister of Education in February 2021.

The Division chose to wait until the budget was released and the financial projections were completed in February before approving this transfer in case either of these items showed the need for these funds for operational purposes. Based on projected results for the 2020-21 fiscal year, funds are available in Division Unallocated operating reserves as a result of unplanned surpluses in hold harmless and internally restricted accounts, a projected standard cost surplus, return of excess insurance equity, and other factors.



The primary risk of transferring funds from operating reserves to capital reserves is that the Division will no longer be able to spend the transferred funds on anything other than capital assets (cannot spend on operating needs without ministerial approval). However, management believes this risk is low as there are adequate capital needs within the Division to spend the funds. As well, even with the \$1,000,000 transfer taken into account, EIPS has relatively low capital reserves as compared to other Divisions, as summarized in the table below. The Division will also still have a comfortable amount of operating reserves, comparable to jurisdictions with similar enrolment.

BACKGROUND:

Board Policy 2: Role of the Board, 8.1 Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees approve the budget assumptions.

EIPS establishes assumptions that are the building blocks of the budget. Changes in key assumptions have the potential to significantly affect the budget.

This budget has been developed with the following assumptions:

1. General Operations

The first assumption is that EIPS' operations will align closely to the 2020-21 Spring Budget, except with adjustments for relevant COVID costs. COVID costs were not built into the Spring Budget in 2020-21, as they were not yet known, and the May 31 budget deadline was not extended. This year, COVID costs will be estimated and built into the budget based on current experience to date, and the current COVID situation.

COVID-19 has had a major impact on the Division in 2020-21 and the impacts on the Division's students will be felt for several years to come.



EIPS fundamentally believes that it is the best for students to be physically present in school and, as such, EIPS has decided there will be no out-of-school learning for K-12, unless mandated by the province.

2. Alberta Education

Alberta Education released the *Funding Manual for School Authorities 2021/22 School Year* on March 31, 2021.

The 2021 funding envelope from Alberta Education is based on 17,350 enrolment. As current projected 2021-22 enrolment is less than 17,350, deferred revenue will need to be established for the 2022-23 year. More information on this is included in the enrolment section of this report (section 4). For some specific grants that rely on targeted enrolment counts (such as First Nation Metis Inuit, Refugee, etc.), current projected enrolment may actually be higher than Alberta Education's enrolment calculation. However, EIPS has taken the position to not book any receivables (potential <u>increases</u> in funding) related to WMA from Alberta Education. This is a conservative approach as it is not known for certain what final enrolment will be, and whether Alberta Education will change the funding manual (including funding rates) for the 2022-23 year and we need to be cautious of that. Any reductions in enrolment will be set up as deferred revenue. Final deferred revenue will be calculated in the fall.

The school nutrition program will continue with Lamont Elementary and Bruderheim School.

3. Other Funding

- \$6.1 million in federal funding for COVID received in 2020-21 will not be received for 2021-22.
- Lease funding from Alberta Education for Strathcona Christian Secondary and Strathcona Christian Elementary has been included in the budget. Confirmation of this lease support (\$651,746) will not come until much later (last year confirmation was received Aug. 28, 2020)
- Funding for Mental Health Capacity Building (MHCB) grant of \$225,061 will remain for 2021-22. Our contract is in place until Aug. 31, 2022. Supports for Students (SFS) has confirmed with its MHCB lead.
- Fee collection rates next year will be similar to 2018-19 (over 90%) which was the last normal year of operations.
- The Program Unit Funding students will be able to be assessed by the deadlines imposed by Alberta Education.
- French Funding has been included in the Spring Budget in the amount of \$120,000. This is a conservative estimate currently and will be updated as more information becomes known.
- Odyssey and Dual Credit have been removed from the Spring Budget as at this time it is not known if support will continue and for what amount.
- School Generated Funds (SGF) are anticipated to return to normal business and have been included in the Spring Budget for 100% of 2018-19 actuals.



4. Enrolment (Attachment 1)

The usage of Weighted Moving Average (WMA) has continued in the *Funding Manual for School Authorities for 2021-22*. The majority of funding (50%) is based on the number of students enrolled as of Sept. 30, 2021, so it is important that enrolment projections are developed carefully. An over-estimate would result in a risk to EIPS as the funding received in the current year will be clawed back in the subsequent year. Underestimating enrolment numbers would result in reduced funding that would not be collected until the following year.

Due to reduced enrolment in 2020-21, EIPS set aside deferred revenue in anticipation of this additional funding being clawed back in 2021-22. However, due to COVID impacts in the province, Alberta Education will be holding school divisions "harmless" for the reduced enrolment experienced and not clawing these funds back. The Minister of Education has been clear that this will not be the case for 2021-22 projected enrolments; if school divisions over-estimate their enrolment, there will be a claw back in 2022-23.

For 2021-22, we continued to perfect our enrolment estimation process developed three years ago. With four years' experience utilizing this estimation process, we are more confident in the numbers provided to Alberta Education. In January 2021, enrolment was estimated to be 17,350 for Sept. 30, 2021. This estimate was made assuming that 2021-22 will be a normal year, and that the majority of students who left to home education or deferred kindergarten for a year will return. The 2021 funding profile was calculated using 17,350 students. Enrolment was determined primarily by using data from the new student and returning student registration process. The projections from Baragars were also used and enrolment will still fluctuate between now and Sept. 30, 2021.

Similar to 2020-21 where enrolment was projected in the spring and actual fall enrolment numbers were different, the same considerations will be made in 2021-22. Where there has been an overestimate of enrolment, there will be a claw back. School budgets will be increased if there is an enrolment increase.

Since January, the re-registration process has been completed and enrolment on March 18 was 17,176 (with adjustments for kindergarten and Next Step Outreach).

Enrolment of 17,176 (including the Next Step schools) has been determined. This also includes an estimate of pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students; however, staffing will not be completed for those students until they are confirmed.

Five years of enrolment data is below (excluding Next Step schools and Elk Island Youth Ranch*).

Enrolment for Outreach is currently estimated to be consistent with 2020-21 levels at 267 students.

Total enrolment at this time is estimated to be 17,176. There is still some uncertainty regarding this number. With an unstable economy in response to COVID-19, there is the potential for the number of returning Grade 12 students to increase, and with the Alberta economy collapsing more than other provinces, there is also the risk enrolment could decrease as families migrate out of province. For those students who cannot return to the Division for health reasons, EIPS is anticipating there could be a small number of students who decide to leave the Division for home education. Enrolment will continue to be "trued" up from now until the fall. EIPS has set aside some dollars in TBA for potential enrolment reductions.

5. Compensation

There was no economic increase projected (all staff salaries have a 0% increase). Inflationary salary costs (grid movement and benefit costs) continue.

The use of standard costs for certificated and classified staff at the schools ensures staffing decisions are based on hiring the best person as opposed to the actual cost of individuals. It also provides timely reporting to aid monitoring and projections at the schools as costs are charged over 10 months instead of tied to how individuals are paid.

The goal is to develop a standard cost for use by schools and ensure it is as close to actual as possible. A standard cost set too high will create a surplus that should have been spent on current year students. A standard cost set too low will create a deficit that must be paid from funds designated for students in future years. Neither situation is ideal but the risk to the Division is greater if a deficit is created.

a) <u>Standard Costs – Schools</u>

The 2020-21 methodology used to calculate certificated standard costs was revised to reflect staff demographics and reduce the Division's risk to large surplus or deficit. As the Division continues to face a tight fiscal environment, the new methodology was used again for 2021-22. Staffing was examined in detail to identify the actual staff assignments expected for 2021-22 and from this list, actual salary costs were calculated based on each individual's placement on the grid with adjustment for salary increments expected to be earned during 2021-22.



Certificated standard costs are impacted by retirements (and their replacements), maternity leaves (and their replacements), sick leaves, full-time to part-time changes, grid movement (including its timing), economic adjustments (none this year) and benefit changes.
As in 2020-21, FTE reductions have been factored into the calculation for 2021-22. The reduction of probationary and temporary teaching positions increase overall standard cost because our staffing mix has a greater number of more experienced teachers than there would have been in prior years.

b) Classified standard costs were calculated in the same conservative manner as last year

- The weighted average hourly salary for permanent educational assistants (EAs) and hourly EAs
 were separately calculated. EAs are the largest classified group and permanent EAs have a
 significantly higher salary and benefit cost than do hourly EAs. By keeping the permanent and
 hourly EA salary calculations separate, we reduce the risk of a standard cost deficit should the ratio
 of permanent EAs to hourly EAs increase.
- For all other classified positions, only permanent staff salaries were used in calculating the standard cost rate. This is a change from prior year, but due to tight budget constraints, it is anticipated that very few hourly staff will be hired in 2021-22.
- For paygrades with less than five employees, the highest pay rate was applied to the entire paygrade.
- The following factors were considered: increments (grid movement) were projected to Aug. 31, 2021 and for 2021-22, economic adjustments (none this year), vacation costs and benefit rate changes.

c) Standard Cost – Benefits

- Benefit changes to both certificated and classified staff were also considered.
- ASEBP has indicated that premium rates for 2021-22 will increase by 7.85% overall with additional increases in the next two years anywhere from 4% to 8%. EIPS is seeing increases higher than the 7.85% quoted above. In the area of extended health care, the monthly premium has increased for the family rate by \$27/month (11.73% increase), and the dental family rate has increased \$15/month (15% increase). These are significant increases. ASEBP has had several years of relatively stable premium rates that were subsidized through excess investment returns. The pandemic and its impact on investment markets has resulted in an accelerated depletion of the fund used for those premium subsidies. As a result, the ASEBP trustees are working toward balancing premium rates with actual premium costs. Recognizing these are difficult economic times, this is anticipated to occur over a period of three years.
 - The Experience Adjustment for Life Insurance, Accidental Death & Dismemberment and Extended Disability is a 5% discount (2020-21 10% discount).
 - Pension contribution rates for 2021 for classified staff will remain at 2020 rates as no increase has been approved; no change in rates is projected for 2022.
 - Board supported benefit premiums for Life/AD&D, Extended Disability, Extended Health Care,
 Dental and Vision are 100% for both certificated and classified staff.



- Health Spending Account (HSA) and Wellness Spend Account (WSA) costs have been estimated based on usage of 100% (2020-21 – 100%).
- CPP rates have increased by 4.6% from 5.45% to 5.7%
- EI maximum insurable earnings increased by \$2,100.
- WCB premiums have increased by \$0.09 per \$100 of earnings (or 13.4%), primarily for classified staff.

An example of increased benefit costs for an employee with a family earning \$85,000:

- Dental, vision and health family rate has increased by \$537 per FTE,
- CPP/EI is \$310 more,
- Life and AD&D is \$12 more,
- Extended disability is \$126 more and
- WCB is \$76 more.
- Certificated standard cost will increase 1.7% (\$1,765) to \$106,935 (\$94,431 in salary and \$12,504 in benefits). With approximately 794 active FTE this increase equates to \$1,401,410. This increase is due to reductions in FTE, an increased percentage of staff at higher levels on the pay grid, along with increased benefit costs.
- The classified standard cost changes range from an increase of 0.7% to 5.5% due to grid movement, removing hourly staff from the average and changes in benefit costs. EA salary rates increased by 0.6% (\$0.17/hour).

Once allocations to schools are finalized, standard cost will need to be revisited. Staffing changes may be greater than anticipated.

6. Reserves:

The provincial government introduced Bill 5 in 2020, which results in school divisions requiring ministerial approval to access operating reserves. This includes SGF, all reserves at schools and departments (including Student Transportation) and Division allocated and unallocated reserves. It will be very important to ensure EIPS budgets the correct amount of reserve usage for schools and departments.

The <u>use of reserves</u> will come with the *Report for Recommendation on Allocations and Use of Reserves* on April 22.

Assumptions:

- The Board will approve the \$1 million transfer from Division Unallocated Operating Reserves to Capital Reserves for the 2020-21 year that has been approved by the Minister. The Board needs to approve this before the 2021-22 budget is approved.
- The Minister will approve 100% of our reserve expenditure requests for 2021-22. There is no indication if there is a reserve cap across the province (last year the reserve cap was \$100 million)



- The 2021-22 budget will include:
 - Estimated reserve spending by schools and departments of 1%, with 100% estimate of Student Transportation and Board Governance reserve,
 - o No restriction on the balance of operating reserve balances for Aug. 31, 2021,
 - Use of Division Operating Reserve will come with the Report for Recommendation on Allocations and Use of Reserves on April 22, 2021.
 - Use of SGF reserve to ensure schools have the flexibility to draw down their SGF beyond their opening balance, and
 - Use of capital reserves will come with the Report for Recommendation on Allocations and Use of Reserves on April 22, 2021.

Schools and departments will be allowed to enter up to 1% of their surplus carryforward when they complete their budgets.

a) Access to Operating Reserves

Bill 5 restricts how much reserves school boards can access. We build the budget with how much of the reserves we want to access and then we have to send it to the Minister with the Spring Budget. Information:

- Bill 5 includes all operating reserves encompasses all of Student Transportation's estimate, all of 1% for schools and department operations and all SGF.
- If we want to ask for more reserves after the Spring Budget, we have to submit a request to the Minister (may or may not be approved) and the response time is quite slow.
- There is no indication if there is a reserve cap across the province (last year the reserve cap was \$100 million).

Because of the above restrictions:

- EIPS will estimate (on a consolidated basis) 1% of reserve carryforward for schools and departments. Schools and departments will only carryforward the surplus they truly end with (up to 1%), but the Division will project estimated surpluses at 1% for all.
- Student Transportation will include its entire reserve carryforward as it is targeted.
- Board Governance will include its entire reserve carryforward
- EIPS will also assume that schools and departments will use 100% of their reserves in 2021-22, due to Bill 5. That is why you see the estimated reserve balances for schools and departments to be zero on Aug. 31, 2022. It is likely schools and departments will not do this, but if we do not make this assumption and they do use it all, we will be in trouble under Bill 5 (we cannot use more reserves than we budgeted for).

b) Balance of Operating Reserves

There is no restriction on the balance of operating reserve balances for Aug. 31, 2021. The balance of operating reserves restriction comes into effect on operating reserves that exclude SGF are Aug. 31, 2023 as per below:



- The requirement for ministerial approval of spending or transferring operating reserves is a two-year temporary measure. Commencing with the 2022/23 school year, a cap on the amount of operating reserves will be implemented as per the new Education funding model.
- Per Alberta Education, the CAP is calculated at 3.15% of operating expenditures and does not apply to SGF reserves.

c) Use of Division Operating Reserve -Two Year plan for Division Unallocated Reserves

The Division Unallocated Operating Reserve is to cover potential emergent issues and price fluctuations, and to stabilize funding in future years. The Board tries to maintain the Division Unallocated Reserve at a minimum of 2% of EIPS budgeted operating expenses or approximately \$4 million.

Given that the Board is planning for the use of Division Unallocated Reserves over the next two years, a change in methodology when building projections was made this year to be conservative. The projected transfers to Division Unallocated Reserves from schools and departments for operating surpluses >1% have **not** been included as schools and departments may still have unanticipated costs from March to August that will reduce their surplus. At the end of February, projected surpluses >1% were \$0.27 million at schools, \$0.36 million at Supports for Students - Schools and \$0.36 million at departments for a total of \$0.99 million. This has **not** been included in Division Unallocated Reserves.

d) Use of SGF

It is difficult to determine how much schools will decrease their reserve balance in 2021-22. Administration will bring an estimate in the *Report for Recommendation on Allocations and Use of Reserves* on April 22.

e) Use of Capital Reserves

Capital Reserves can be used for the purchase of future capital assets and can be accessed with Board approval. Every year, capital items are purchased from the operating budget in schools and departments (\$100,000 to \$500,000 per year). These items could be designated to be paid from capital reserves in any given year by the Board. To access capital reserves for operating expenses, the Division would have to obtain permission from the Minister.

EIPS Division Allocated Capital Reserve projects are being discussed as equipment costs for schools \$100,000 and Information Technology \$300,000. The information will be in the *Report for Recommendation on Allocations and Use of Reserves* on April 22.

Emergent items would be subject to Board approval but will not require Ministerial approval. One item of concern is the parking lot at Central Services. IMR dollars cannot be used to fund repairs or capital items at Central Services. The surface of the lot has been worsening over time. While Facility Services has been exploring options, the decision was made to first deal with drainage of the parking lot and once rectified, address the surface. It will also be helpful to see the Alberta government's



transportation study. One area of the parking lot may or may not need additional underground reenforcement depending on the amount of bus usage.

If there are additional funds at the end of 2020-21 in the Division Unallocated Reserves, and EIPS can identify a need, EIPS may consider requesting additional dollars be moved into the capital reserve to allow for the purchase of potential capital items in the future. This request would come to the Board in the fall of 2022. Ministerial approval would also need to be obtained.

7. Expenses

a) <u>Insurance</u>

In 2020-21, EIPS changed insurance providers due to the 271% liability insurance premium increase in 2019-20 under its former insurance partner, ASBIE. EIPS is now with Rural Municipalities of Alberta (RMA) and has experienced a significant decrease in insurance premiums for 2020-21. As the insurance market continues to be a "hard" market, they have provided a range of increases from 10% - 15% for liability and property coverage and 20% to 25% for contracted bus operators – assuming no large losses within the program or even within the province. If these happen, there could be a further negative impact on next year's rates. To be conservative, the budget has been built with higher percentages for each category of insurance premiums for 2021-22. These percentage increases were provided based on the assumption that there are no large losses within the program or the province.

b) Carbon Tax

Carbon tax costs will continue to be factored into the budget. The federal rate is to increase from \$40/tonne to \$50/tonne effective April 1, 2022. On March 25, 2021, the Supreme Court of Canada ruled that the federal carbon pricing law is constitutional. This ended Alberta's challenge of this law and the removal of the Carbon Tax from Albertans.

c) Hold Harmless

Hold Harmless in Facilities (utilities) and HR (sick leave, maternity leave, red circle, top up). A lot of these are based on three-year averages. EIPS will use2018-19, 2017-18, and 2016-17 but adjusted for any rate changes and/or non-Covid trends (2019-20 and 2020-21 have too many COVID implications built into them to use in the average calculation).

d) Next Step Leases

There are savings for Next Step Outreach as two of the leases have been cancelled (Vegreville and Sherwood Park). The Outreach schools will be moving into Vegreville Composite High School and Salisbury Composite High School accordingly.

8. Inflation

There are inflationary non-salary costs that are expected to increase. The overall consumer price index (CPI) for the province has increased only slightly by 0.6% from February 2020 to February 2021. While the CPI is not reflective of all costs a school board would incur, there are many similarities such as furnishings,



equipment, food for courses, reading materials, etc. These inflationary costs will be covered by schools and departments. Of note for utilities and busing costs, of all commodity category increases, energy increased the most at 9.2%.

9. Board System and Administration (BSA)

This targeted grant remains at the 2020-21 funding level at \$6,297,328. EIPS has reviewed the prescribed list and is confident it will be below the grant amount. As in 2020-21, any unused portions can be used towards other Board expenditures such as instruction.

10. Department Estimates

The draft budget presented to the Board on May 26, 2021 will include a list of major assumptions and estimates used by departments to prepare budgets.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once approved, the budget assumptions will be incorporated into the 2021-22 Budget. Leadership will be asked to submit balanced budgets which will be consolidated into the Division budget.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Trustees approve the 2021-22 school fees, as presented.

BACKGROUND:

In January 2021, the Board set parameters for the 2021-22 school fees. The parameters were set to ensure students achieve a quality education, but also to ensure that fees are not cost-prohibitive for parents. Following is the list of parameters to guide principals in for establishing 2021-22 school fees:

Fee Type	Parameter
Optional courses	Fees can be increased up to 5% if at cost recovery. Food courses will be allowed to increase up to 7%. Requires an explanation.
Noon supervision	Fees can be increased up to 5% if at cost recovery. Requires an explanation.
Activity fees (field trips)	Fees can be increased >5% if at cost recovery. Requires an explanation.
Extra-curricular	Fees can be increased >5% if at cost recovery. Requires an explanation.
Non-curricular travel (overnight ski or band trips)	Fees can be increased >5% if at cost recovery. Requires an explanation.
Non-curricular goods and services (Student Union)	Fees can be increased up to 5% if at cost recovery. Requires an explanation.



Families are increasingly under financial constraints. COVID-19 public health measures have resulted in the loss of income and jobs for many families in an already weak economy. EIPS aims to provide high-quality education by balancing the budget constraints with the fiscal realities of our families.

Schools were encouraged to be generic, if possible, when setting fees to allow teachers flexibility when unforeseen circumstances arise. For example, when a field trip is cancelled due to weather, they can replace it with a new field trip at the same cost without the need for additional approval.

EIPS sent the parameters to schools once they were approved by the Board and the process, as described in Attachment 1, was followed to the best of each school's ability. Consultation with parent council was done virtually due to current COVID-19 restrictions.

School fees that exceed established parameters are listed in Attachment 2. New courses or programs are listed in Attachment 3. Change in fees per student from 2020-21 to 2021-22 are shown in Attachment 4. The report is organized from highest to \$10 and the remainder of fees were not included. Finally, respective fee schedules for each school are grouped together in Attachment 5.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once approved by the Board, schools will be notified of the approval and the fees will be posted on each school's website.

Establishing School Fees for 2021-22

Process and timelines

1. Parameters for setting fees (January)

Parameters are important as schools strive to improve/add to the value of education without impact to their budgets. The parameters help guide schools and protect parents. Parameters will be set by the Board in January.

2. Initial parent consultation (January)

Principals will hold an initial consultation with parents prior to setting, increasing, or decreasing fees. Questions and parent responses will assist schools in developing the fee schedule.

- 1) Email/contact all parents at least two weeks prior to the school council meeting to:
 - Indicate that school fees will be discussed (course fees, noon supervision, activity fees, and extra-curricular – including sports);
 - Provide parents with a current fee schedule (by attachment or link to the website);
 - Provide a list of questions for consideration; and
 - Supply a mechanism for obtaining parent feedback for those who are unable to attend the school council meeting.
- 2) Specifically, ask for input on the following:
 - Optional courses and associated fees
 - Noon supervision
 - Field trips and associated fees
 - Extracurricular activities
 - Non-curricular travel (for example, ski trips and band camps)
 - Non-curricular goods and services (for example, student union and yearbooks)

3. Fee submission template (February)

Financial Services will provide a template to schools for completing proposed fees for the new school year. Proposed fees will be established by using the parameters approved by the Board, principal discretion, parent feedback, and fee calculation tools.

4. Second parent meeting (March/April)

A second meeting with parents must be held to share proposed fees and the rationale for additions, increases, decreases, etc.

- 1) Email all parents at least two weeks prior to the school council meeting to indicate there will be a review of proposed school fees for 2021-22. The email will include the proposed fees.
- 2) After the meeting, the Principal and School Council Chair will sign a declaration affirming completion of all required steps. A checklist will be included on the declaration form.

- 5. Proposed fee schedules and declarations are due to Financial Services (March/April)
- 6. Financial Services will prepare school fee schedules for presentation to the Board (April)
- 7. The Board will review/approve proposed fees. If possible, timing will be such that they are not presented in the same month as the Spring Budget is presented. (May)

8. Course Registration

As registration occurs prior to the approval of fees, the proposed fee schedule, as presented at the second parent council meeting, or prior year's fees, will accompany registration forms (or course handbooks) as "estimated" fees for the 2021-22 school year and subject to Board approval. Communication must be made by email to all parents with the list of proposed fees.

9. Extra-curricular/Sports teams

Before a student can try out for a team, parents must be made aware of both the financial and time obligations for participation. Prior to tryouts, schools will email parents of students signed up for tryouts outlining the fee, practice and game schedules, responsibilities of team members, and other relevant information.

10. Fee additions/changes

The Board recognizes that, during the school year, flexibility is needed to make fee additions or changes for missed fees or new opportunities. These will be subject to approval by the Superintendent and Secretary-Treasurer. Two reports will be presented to the Board at Caucus meetings in January and June with any approved changes.

11. Tracking

Schools are required to individually track costs related to fees for courses, activities/field trips, and other revenue to ensure details on fees and offsetting costs are readily available.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve the Facility Rental and Lease Fees for the 2021-22 school year.

BACKGROUND:

Policy 2: Role of the Board, Section 8.11 Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees will annually approve various administrative fees, including the leasing and rental fees.

Leasing of school facilities shall be considered on the basis of functional compatibility, space availability, land use compliance, and financial impact. The Division believes that after Division requirements have been met, the community shall have a reasonable access to Division facilities (AP546). Offering surplus space to before and after school care programs supports the families of EIPS' students by having consistent and safe care for their children. Preschool programming provides opportunities for future students to reach social, intellectual, and physical developmental milestones, imperative for kindergarten and grade 1 readiness.

Supporting communities, students, and families to engage in activities to promote healthy lifestyles continues to be a high priority for the Division. The use of gymnasiums and other division space will be offered to the community at rates based on actual cost recovery of costs incurred by the Division.



RECOMMENDATION REPORT

Rental Fees:

Overall, operating costs have remained similar to prior year. Facility Services has recognized some savings from reduced insurance premiums, obtaining a lower natural gas rate, and decreased consumption of water. On the other hand, increased costs largely revolve around COVID; increased custodial service levels and custodial supplies. Consideration is given for the importance of providing the community with accessibility to facilities for physical and mental wellness.

Lease Rates:

As per AP 546, lease rates for 'non-profit' organizations shall, at minimum, be on a cost-recovery basis. Lease rates for 'for-profit' organizations shall, at minimum, be set at a reasonable rate of return. EIPS proposes to maintain current lease rates for the following year. At these rates, non-profits rates are set at cost recovery and for-profit rates just below average. EIPS will remain a below-average cost provider of surplus space, which is pertinent to our communities.

COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Following approval by the Board on April 22, 2021, the rental rates will be updated on the EIPS website and communicated to the Leadership Group. All after hours facility rental user groups, daycares, and before and after school care groups will then be notified of the approved rate changes via email.

EIPS may enter into service agreements with a resident school division for non-resident students who require specialized supports and services beyond what the basic grant provides. If a service agreement is declined, the student must return to the resident board.

In 2018-19, EIPS established a fee schedule for students who require specialized supports and services in both inclusive settings and system programs.

Attached is the fee schedule to guide the development of service agreements. These calculations are based on typical resources required to support students with special needs. The increase in fees is included to reflect increases to standard cost for certificated and classified staff in specialized system programs.

Estimated total fees charged to Elk Island Catholic Schools for P4S Kits for the 2021-22 school year are based on 2020-21 enrolment. A \$25.00 restocking charge will continue to be used for the 2021-22 school year as a means to minimize kits that are returned late, as this negatively impacts programming for the next receiving school.

Once approved, the fees for 2021-22 will be communicated to Elk Island Catholic Schools (EICS) who utilize the P4S Kits throughout their Division.

Fees for Alberta Non-residents and International Students are administered for the purpose of recovering education programming costs for students who are not eligible to receive provincial funding.

No increase is proposed for the 2021-22 school year. The rates for 2019-20 were increased by 12%, based on the 2019 Association of School Business Officials of Alberta (ASBOA) School Fees Survey, which showed EIPS' fees to be below the average charged by participating school divisions. Increasing by 12% aligned EIPS near the average of what other Alberta school divisions are charging.

For the 2020-21 school year, one half-year student and four full-year international students are in attendance. There are no Alberta non-resident students registered with EIPS in 2020-21.

Given that EIPS' resources are not infinite, the following fee schedule would provide the Division with an option for this very specific, and likely rare, situation.

On occasion, EIPS is asked to provide PALS programming for a typically developing twin of a student with a diagnostic profile that would qualify them for Program Unit Funding.

Providing programming for the typically developing twin, along with their sibling, is beneficial for both children and potentially beneficial for the PALS program. Families benefit by being able to share and practice the knowledge, skills and attributes learned in PALS with both twins. Repetition and reinforcement play critical roles in early childhood development and success. PALS programs also benefit by having another peer model of speech, language, and social interaction within the classroom.

BACKGROUND:

Policy 2: Role of the Board, Section 8.11 Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees will approve various administrative fees annually, including the student transportation fees.

Alberta Education provides transportation funding based on the following criteria:

- Students attending their designated school and residing greater than 2.39 km to the school; or
- Students attending a non-designated school and residing greater than 2.39 km to both their designated school and the school they are attending.



Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) Student Transportation provides an enhanced busing service to students that exceeds the mandated service as outlined by Alberta Education. This enhanced service provides provisions for:

- Students attending a non-designated school,
- Students attending a designated school and residing less than 2.4 km from the school; or
- Students requiring transportation to an address other than their home address.

Charging fees acts as a method for cost recovery to offset the funding shortfall of the incremental costs of providing transportation services as set forth in Policy 17: Student Transportation Services. *School Transportation Regulation AR96/2019*, Section 7(4) reads:

 "Any surplus from transportation fees charged under subsection (1) or (2) must be used to subsidize the cost of transportation of students referred to in that subsection in the two school years following the school year in which the surplus was collected."

School Transportation Regulation AR96/2019, Section 8 sets forth the requirements of a board to establish, maintain and implement policies respecting the transportation of students and the fees it proposes to charge. Section 9 and 10 reference the requirement to establish a fee schedule of transportation fees, listing each type of transportation fee, with its amount, that may be charged in that school year.

When proposing a recommendation for the 2021-22 Transportation Fee Schedule the following factors were taken into consideration:

- An analysis of the revenue vs. expenditures of the Student Transportation budget both current year and 2021-22,
- An estimate of anticipated ridership for the 2021-22 school year based on February 2021 returning student registration busing requests and new student registrations,
- The assumption that all students will return to full-time in-class studies in September 2021,
- That Student Transportation receives the same level of funding in 2021-22 as this current year
 of \$245,000 from the Board to offset additional cleaning costs for COVID response protocol,
- That approximately \$50,000 in fees will be waived; and
- Diesel fuel calculated at \$1.30/litre adjusting for carbon tax and inflation.

The information that follows is supporting documentation of the above factors used to establish an appropriate fee schedule for the 2021-22 school year.

For the 2021-22 school year transportation funding will be calculated using the 2020-21 grant funding rather than on the method used in past. This method is being used in the interim while the minister's office reviews the results of the Transportation Task Force.

The data in the table below is the 2021-22 student rider projection based on the February 2021 returning registration and new registrations completed by families that have requested transportation.



A total of 8437 riders including EIPS, EICS and New Horizons is estimated and has been used in calculating fee projections for the 2021-22 school year.

Budgeted fee waivers were calculated by using an average of 2018-19 and 2019-20 school years. The calculation was a weighted average percentage of waived fees of 3.61% and an average number of student fees waived of 126. The calculation equated to approximately \$50,000 estimated in fee waivers.

The cost of diesel fuel has risen significantly from \$.847/litre in September 2020 to \$1.10/litre in April 2021. There are two factors driving the increased cost diesel fuel:

- 1. The carbon tax levied on diesel fuel as of April 1st, 2021, is a total of 10.73 cents per litre with the scheduled increase in April 2022 to a total of 13.41 cents per litre.
- 2. The forecasted trend is for diesel fuel to continue to rise as the economy is expected to rebound and then level off in the latter quarter of 2021.

Historically, EICS and EIPS transportation fees have aligned but after both school divisions adopted new fee structures in the 2020-21 school year a misalignment occurred. Further information provided in the chart below draws a comparison between EICS and EIPS transportation fees.

The proposed 2021-22 Student Transportation fee schedule below does not reflect an increase in fees from the current fee schedule. This fee schedule is for transportation fees assessed to students attending EIPS, EICS and New Horizon that access transportation bus service. Payment plans will continue to be offered to families over a six-month period starting in September and ending in February with a threshold of \$300 to qualify. This proposed fee schedule reflects a balanced budget for the 2021-22 school year with consideration of the factors above:

That the Board of Trustees approve the recommendation that effective the 2021-22 school year students who currently reside in the Andrew Attendance Boundary and choose to attend a non-designated school no longer be considered for exemption from the Student Transportation ineligible fee.

BACKGROUND:

When the closure of the high school program at Andrew School took place effective the 2019-20 school year new boundaries were established and students were re-designated to either Lamont High or Vegreville Composite High. The Board of Trustees allowed students to attend either school without the assessment of a non-designated fee for transportation. This decision was made with the provision that the decision would be reviewed on a yearly basis. Two students chose to attend a non-designated school and were therefore exempt from the school of choice or ineligible fee.

Effective the 2020-21 school year the closure of the junior high program at Andrew School took place and students were re-designated using the same boundaries that were established for the high school. Students residing in the Andrew attendance area attending a junior high program could either attend Lamont High or



Vegreville Composite High. Four students chose to attend a non-designated school but were not exempt from the ineligible transportation fee.

In the chart below is data for the current grade 6-11 students that are registered to attend a non-designated school for the 2021-22 school year.

School Transportation Regulation AR96/2019, Section 7 of the regulation specifies the requirements when determining student transportation fees. Section 8 sets forth the requirements of a board to establish, maintain and implement policies respecting the transportation of students and the fees it proposes to charge. Section 9 and 10 reference the requirement to establish a fee schedule of transportation fees, listing each type of transportation fee, with its amount, that may be charged in that school year.

Alberta Education's position has always been that school of choice fee amounts must be levied consistently at the same rate for all resident students who are attending a non-designated school regardless of what program they attend or where they reside.

An audit by Alberta Education several years ago required that EIPS establish only one fee schedule and that students were charged according to established criteria. In rare cases where students are directed by the Associate Superintendent of Supports for Students, the school they are directed to becomes their designated school for the purpose of fee assessment. Direction of any students must be explainable to Alberta Education in order claim the student on the transportation funding claim.

Currently, EIPS has 1221 students who attend a non-designated school and access bus transportation. 1219 students were assessed an ineligible fee of \$325 and two were assessed an eligible fee of \$100. Those two students reside in the Andrew Attendance Boundary.

Historically, when a school closure or boundary change has taken place, EIPS did not provide families who chose to attend a non-designated school a reduced fee for transportation.



COMMUNICATION PLAN:

Once a decision has been made on the proposed recommendation by administration, families who choose to attend a non-designated school and reside in the Andrew Attendance Boundary will be assessed an ineligible fee that follows the current criteria for students in EIPS that attend a non-designated school.

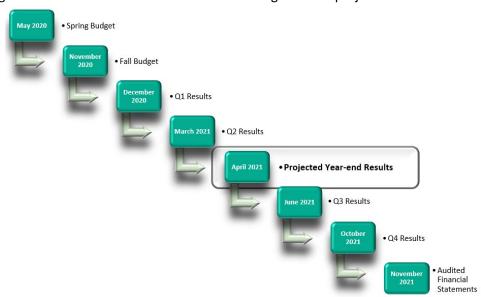

ISSUE:

A financial projection for the 2020-21 year is completed to ensure fiscal management and for incorporation into the 2021-22 Budget.

BACKGROUND:

Policy 2: Role of the Board, Section 8.4, Fiscal Accountability establishes that the Board of Trustees will monitor the fiscal management of the Division. This includes reviewing financial projections.



CURRENT SITUATION OR KEY POINT:

In early March, schools and departments prepared their forecasts using February results. These projections indicated no areas of concern with respect to deficits. EIPS is projecting an increase in accumulated surplus of \$2.6 million from the audited balance as of Aug. 31, 2020, including operating reserves increasing \$2.3 million, capital reserves increasing \$0.3 million and investment in tangible capital assets staying relatively stable.

Given that the Board is planning for the use of Division Unallocated Reserves over the next two years, a change in methodology when building projections was made this year to be conservative. The projected transfers to Division Unallocated Reserves from schools and departments for operating surpluses >1% have **not** been included as schools and departments may still have unanticipated costs from March to August that will reduce their surplus. At the end of February, projected surpluses >1% were \$0.27 million at schools, \$0.36 million at Supports for Students - Schools, and \$0.33 million at departments for a total of \$0.96 million. This has **not** been included in Division Unallocated Reserves.

Due to Bill 5 and its restriction on use of operating reserves, EIPS will estimate (on a consolidated basis) 1% of reserve carryforward for schools and departments. Schools and departments will only carryforward the surplus they truly end with (up to 1%), but the Division will project estimated surpluses at 1% for all. This adjustment has been made on Attachments 4 and 5, and the full 1% has been included in projections. This has resulted in an increase to projections of \$0.19 million for schools and \$0.17 million for departments.

The budget variance is \$7.31 million as the Division has a projected surplus of \$2.59 million and had budgeted a deficit of \$4.72 million. The majority of the variance is related to:

- \$6.06 million Operating Reserves increasing over budget, and
- \$0.97 million Capital Reserves increasing over budget.

Operating Reserves Increasing over Budget \$6.06 million

An increase in Division Unallocated Reserves of \$4.31 million (Attachment 3, Column H, Row K)

The following items contributed to the surplus for Division Unallocated Reserves. This is the result of unbudgeted increases as follows:

• \$1.97 million surplus projected as a result of recognizing *Provincial COVID-19 Mitigation Support* grant. This funding is designed to offset funding adjustments related to decreases in enrolment weighted moving averages. The *Provincial COVID-19 Mitigation Support* is included as part of the *Funding Manual for School Authorities 2021-22 School Year*, but the revenue relates to current year enrolment and therefore should be recognized in 2020-21, as per our auditors. In the 2020-21 Budget, the Division had deferred revenue to offset the expected funding adjustment, as the *Provincial COVID-19 Mitigation Support* was not announced until recently.

If the Board approves any additional funding from this balance, this will reduce the projected balance remaining for TBA and the projected balance for Division Unallocated Reserves.

An increase in Central Services of \$0.42 million (adjusted by \$0.17 million)

Due to Bill 1, departments were budgeted to spend 100% of their budgets, however, Central Services spending was less than planned due to continued effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on Division operations. If department projections hold true, another \$0.33 million will be transferred to Division Unallocated Reserves at year end.



School and SFS school spending was \$1.33 million less than planned (adjusted by \$0.19 million)
Due to Bill 1, schools were budgeted to spend 100% of their budgets, however, spending was less than planned as schools spent conservatively while facing an uncertain, ever-changing school environment due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Supports for Students - Schools is projecting a surplus in Out-of-School Learning as a result of delays in staffing some positions, savings in standard cost vs. actual cost, and changes in supports required for online learning as the year progressed. If school projections hold true, another \$0.63 million will be transferred to Division Unallocated Reserves at year end.

Capital Reserves increased by \$0.97 million

- Increased by \$1 million due to the transfer of \$1 million from Operating to Capital.
- \$80,000 of additional spending for modular connecting links, subject to AE funding.

Final Comments on Surplus

Attachments 4 and 5 show the current financial picture of schools and departments.

Attachment 3 shows the Division Unallocated Reserves. As a percentage of operating expenses (budgeted at \$201,532,895), Division Unallocated reserves are projected at 5.29%. Generally, EIPS plans to maintain 2% of operating expenditures. The estimated dollars greater than 2% are \$6.6 million (Column F).

Generally speaking, surplus is a good thing. However, school divisions must maintain a fine balance between spending the dollars they are allocated in a given year on the students of that year, while still being prudent with its dollars, and ensuring enough of a cushion to be flexible for any unknown emergent items. This was further complicated by Bill 5 restrictions. With an inability to draw down further on operating reserves, and the province indicating school divisions would be penalized if an increased draw down occurred, EIPS was conservative in its estimates of school and department reserve use and will be the 2021-22 year as well.

EIPS faced a very uncertain year like many other organizations in the public sector. The impact and related costs of COVID-19 on our staff were estimated conservatively at the start of the year. Fortunately, we have not seen a number of the estimates come to be. This has resulted in some of our surplus. COVID-19 has also reduced opportunities to carry out some of our normal operations which also resulted in surplus.

Strathcona County recently reported a \$3 million surplus and City of Edmonton has a \$40 million surplus – some funds are being reinvested to COVID-19 costs of future years. The Board will contemplate some of the same possibilities in budget discussions.

<u>First Nation, Métis, and Inuit Allocations Surplus – Schools</u>

Many of the projects that were being developed for 2020-21 have not been realized this year due to COVID-19 and the inability to participate in field trips or have external visitors to the schools. This has created a situation

where there are surpluses in the First Nation, Métis, and Inuit allocations provided to schools. It has been decided that these funds would be returned to the Division for redistribution back to schools for the 2021-22 school year, to be used on First Nation, Métis, and Inuit projects at that time. The amount projected to be returned and redistributed is \$75,480.

Alberta Education – Financial Report Profile (Attachment 6)

Alberta Education prepares a five-year comparative Financial Reporting Profile that compares EIPS to provincial averages and to other comparably sized jurisdictions. This document allows a review and evaluation of current and projected financial position.

A comparison of EIPS operating and capital reserves to other jurisdictions is provided in the table below and in Attachment 6. Projections to Aug. 31, 2021 indicate an increase to operating reserves of 1.19% or 2.98 days and an increase to capital reserves of \$21 per student. If EIPS maintained capital reserves using the average rate of jurisdictions with similar enrolment, reserves would be \$4.7 million. Our capital reserves are still lower than other divisions even with the \$1 million transfer. These statistics are useful for analyzing financial health.

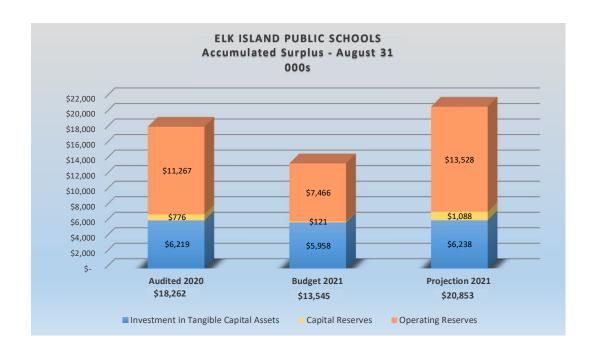

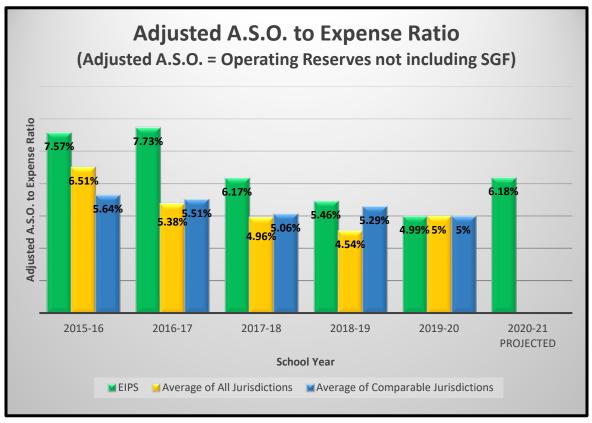

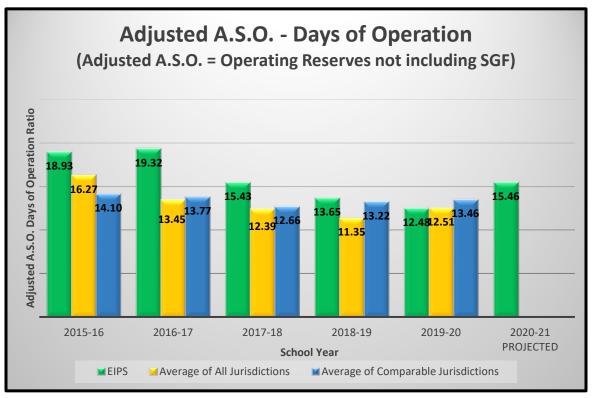
