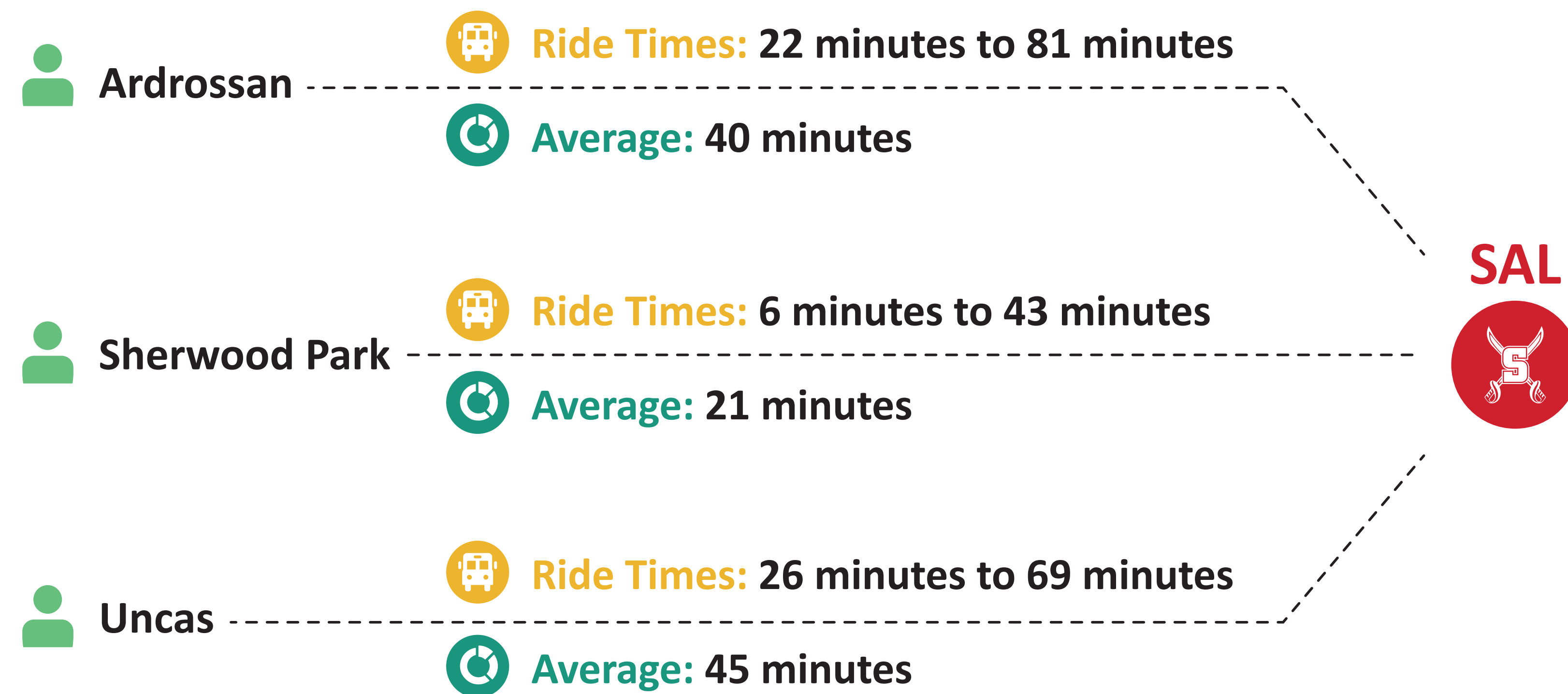


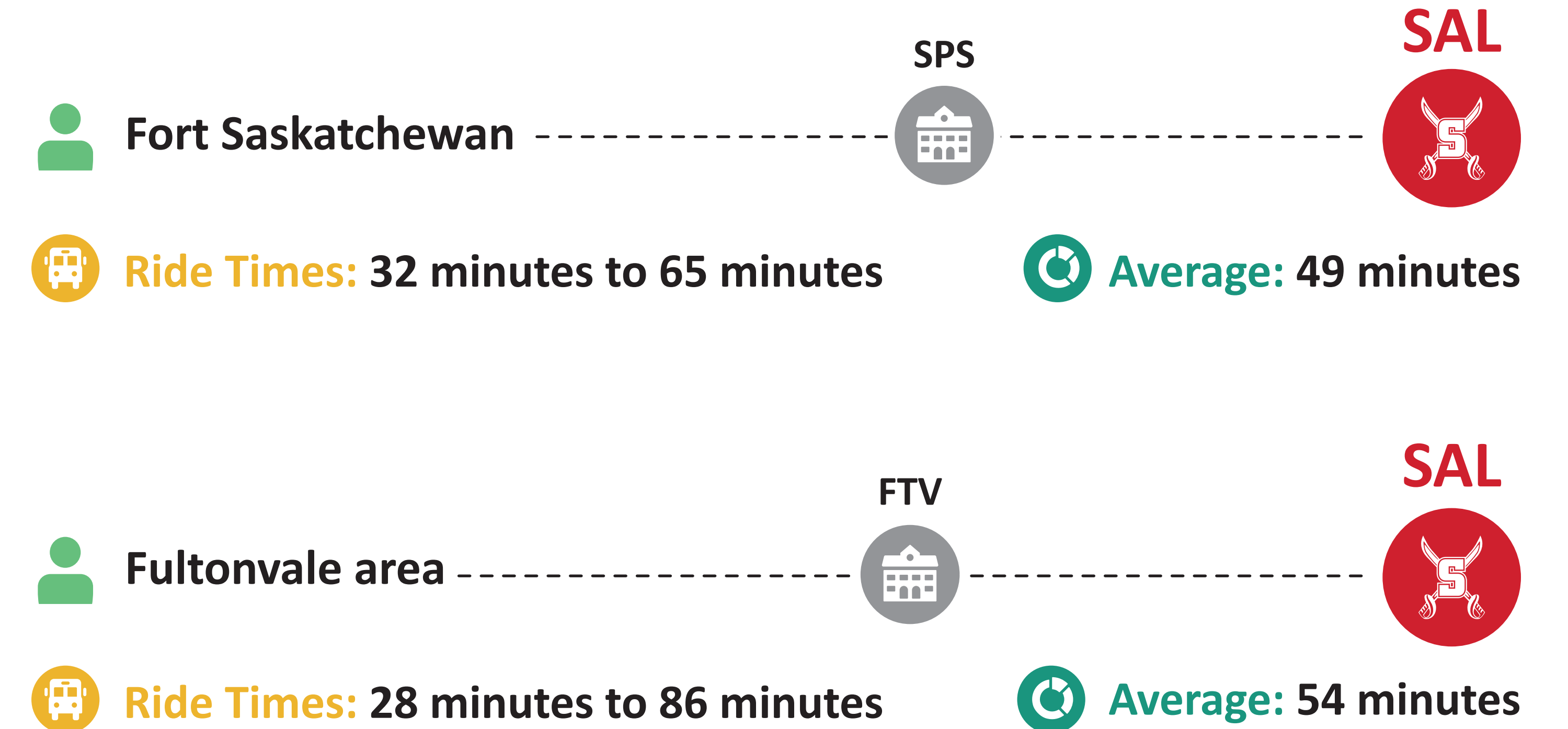
Solution 1: Proposed bus routes and fee information for the 2026-27 school year

Senior High French Immersion | Transition Plan-Draft

Direct buses



Transfer buses



Ride times and routes may change, as they are based on current EIPS riders attending French Immersion.

MORNING ROUTE

- All students living in Ardrossan, Sherwood Park, and some from Uncas, travel directly to Salisbury Composite High from their pickup location. Average ride time: between 21 minutes and 45 minutes
- Students living in Fort Saskatchewan and Fultonvale travel to Salisbury from their pickup location, with one bus transfer, either at SouthPointe School or Fultonvale Elementary Junior High. Average ride time: between 49 minutes and 54 minutes

AFTERNOON ROUTE

- Students living in Ardrossan, Sherwood Park or Uncas travel directly to their drop-off location from Salisbury Composite High. Average ride time: between 21 minutes and 45 minutes.
- Students living in Fort Saskatchewan and the Fultonvale area travel from Salisbury Composite High to their drop-off location, with a bus transfer at either SouthPointe School or Fultonvale Elementary Junior High. Average ride time: between 49 minutes and 54 minutes

NON-DESIGNATED SCHOOL ROUTE

Most students who attend Salisbury Composite High as a non-designated school and want to access Student Transportation travel to the school using a transfer site. Ride times vary depending on where the rider lives.

TRANSPORTATION FEES

EIPS offers an enhanced transportation service for eligible and ineligible riders. Anyone who wants to access existing Student Transportation can request bus services during the new or returning student registration process, which takes place every February.

Eligible rider: a rider who resides more than 2 kilometres from the school they attend.

Ineligible rider: a rider who resides less than 2 kilometres from the school they attend.

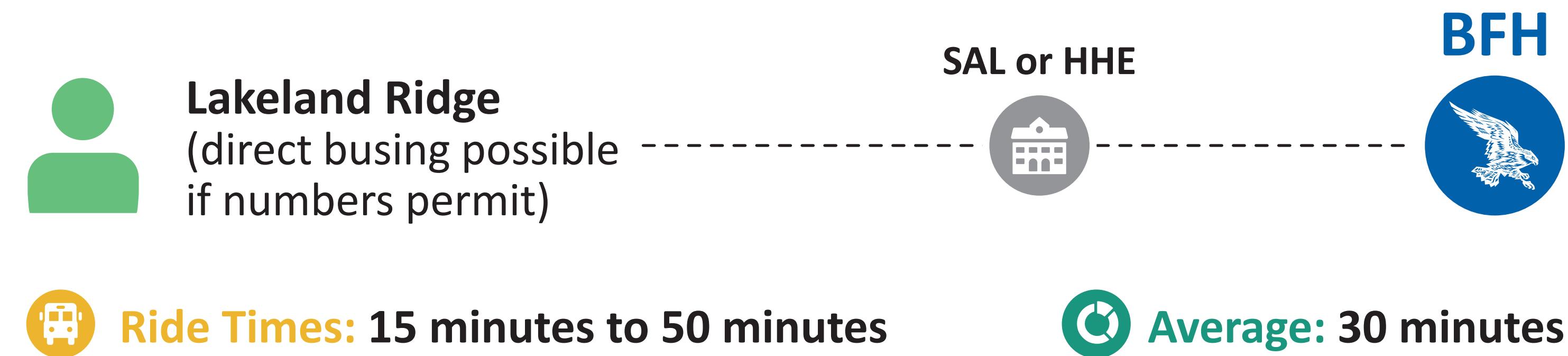
BUS SAFETY & RELIABILITY

Transfer buses



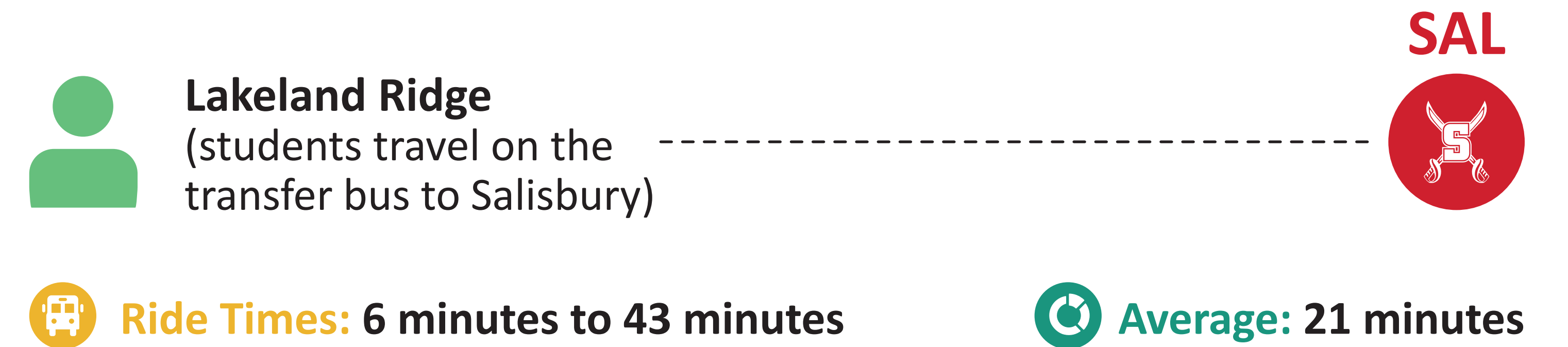
MORNING ROUTE

- Students living in Lakeland Ridge travel to Bev Facey Community High from their pickup location, with a bus transfer at Salisbury Composite High or Heritage Hills Elementary. Average ride time: 30 minutes

AFTERNOON ROUTE

- Students living in Lakeland Ridge travel to their drop-off location from Bev Facey Community High, with a bus transfer at Salisbury Composite High or Heritage Hills Elementary. Average ride time: 30 minutes

Direct buses



MORNING ROUTE

- Students living in Lakeland Ridge who choose to attend Salisbury Composite High travel directly to the school from their pickup location. Average ride time: 21 minutes

AFTERNOON ROUTE

- Students living in Lakeland Ridge who choose to attend Salisbury Composite High travel directly to their drop-off location. Average ride: 21 minutes

Ride times vary depending on where the student lives. Noted times are estimations based on current EIPS riders living in the the Lakeland Ridge area.

NON-DESIGNATED SCHOOL ROUTE

Students not impacted by Solution 2 who choose to attend Bev Facey Community High and want to access Student Transportation can do so and travel to the school using a bus transfer site. Ride times vary depending on where the rider lives.

TRANSPORTATION FEES

EIPS offers an enhanced transportation service for eligible and ineligible riders. Anyone who wants to access existing Student Transportation can request bus services during the new or returning student registration process, which takes place every February.

Eligible rider: a rider who resides more than 2 kilometres from the school they attend.

Ineligible rider: a rider who resides less than 2 kilometres from the school they attend.

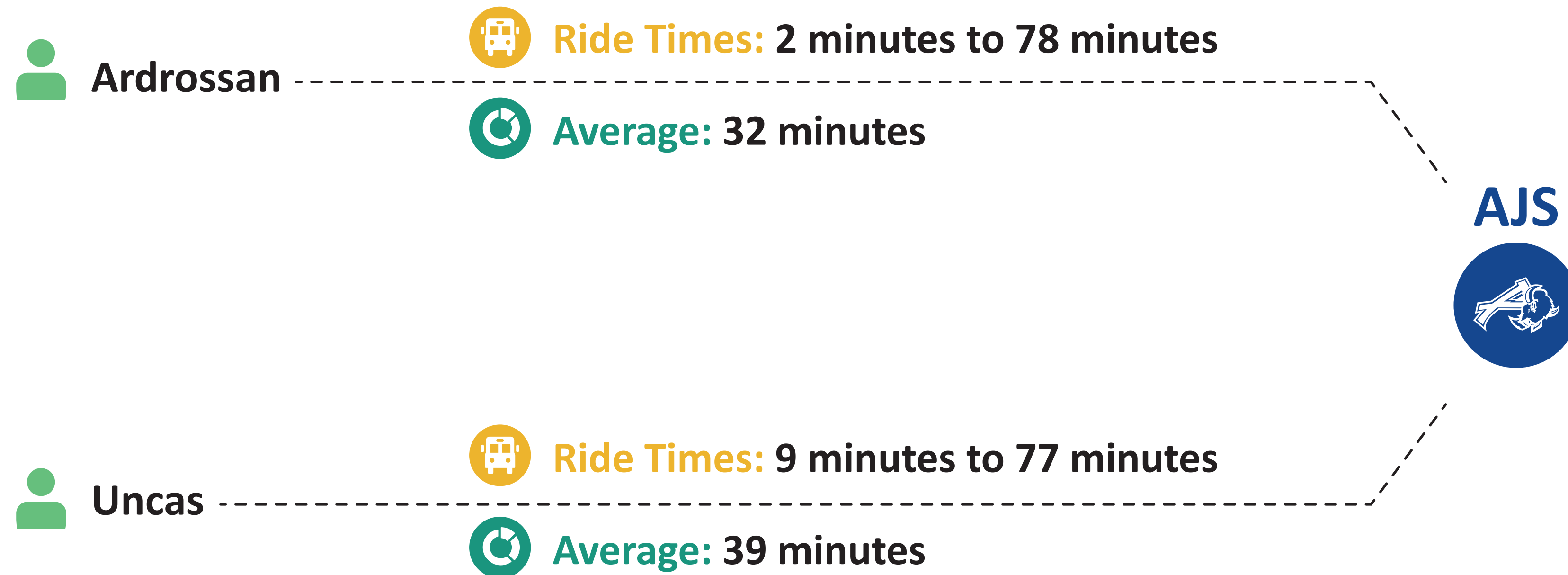

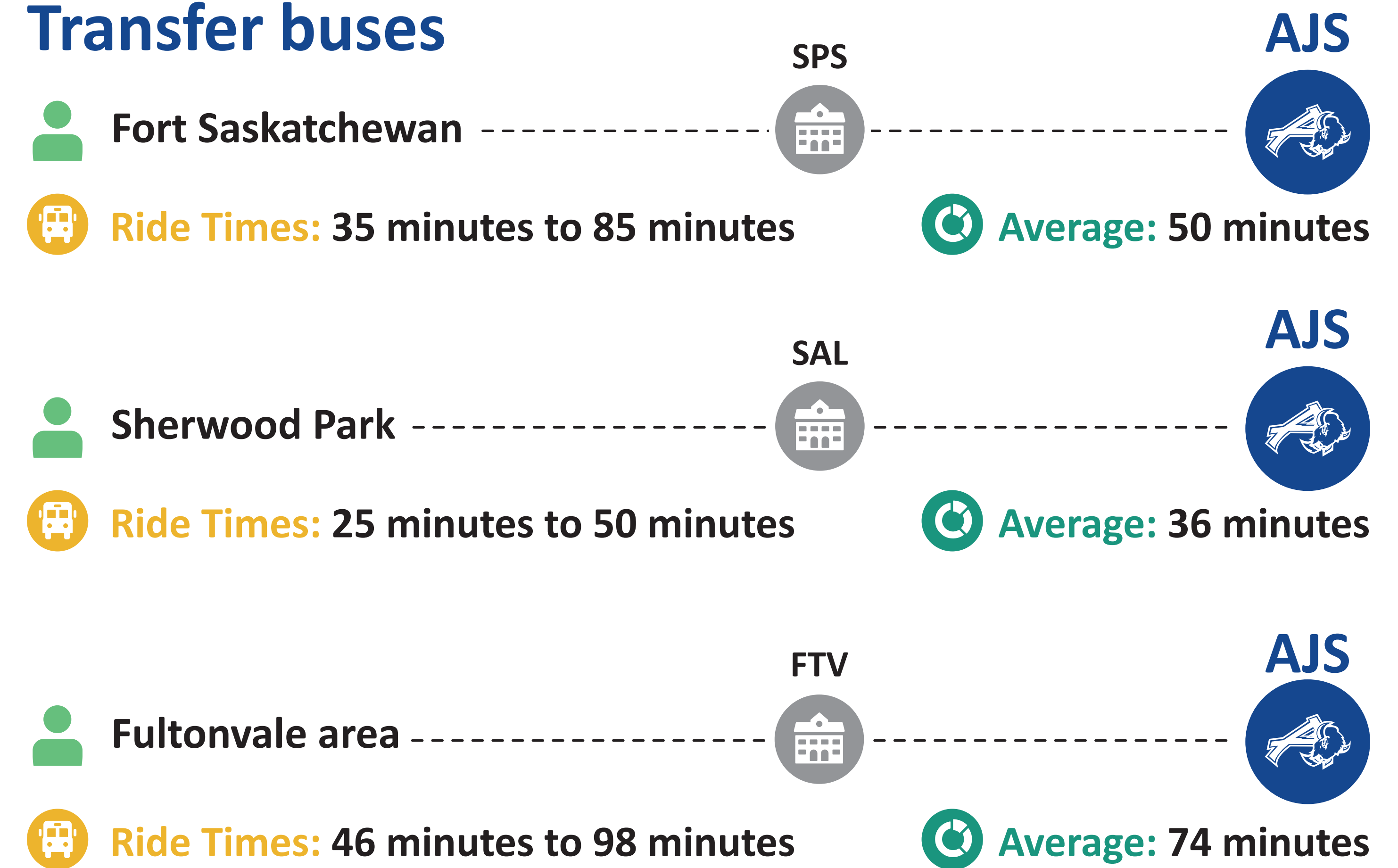


Ardrossan Junior Senior High: Proposed bus routes and fee information

Ride times and routes may change, as they are based on current EIPS Student Transportation riders.

MORNING ROUTE

- Students living in Ardrossan, and some from Uncas, travel directly to Ardrossan Junior Senior High from their pickup location. Average ride time: between 32 minutes and 39 minutes
- Students living in Fort Saskatchewan, Fultonvale or Sherwood Park travel to Ardrossan Junior Senior High from their pickup location, with one bus transfer, either at Salisbury Composite, SouthPointe or Fultonvale Elementary Junior High. Average ride time: between 36 minutes and 74 minutes

AFTERNOON ROUTE

- Students living in Ardrossan and Uncas travel directly to their drop-off location from Ardrossan Junior Senior High. Average ride time: between 32 minutes and 39 minutes.
- Students living in Fort Saskatchewan, Fultonvale or Sherwood Park travel from Ardrossan Junior Senior High to their drop-off location, with a bus transfer at either Salisbury Composite, SouthPointe, or Fultonvale Elementary Junior High. Average ride time: between 36 minutes and 74 minutes

NON-DESIGNATED SCHOOL ROUTE

Students who attend Ardrossan Junior Senior High as a non-designated school and want to access Student Transportation travel to the school using a transfer site. Ride times vary depending on where the rider lives.
